■ Paul Allen's Vulcan Ventures investment group becomes the second largest investor in VR start-up "Virtual Vision, Inc." in Seattle, Wa.

■ Kubota Pacific and Visions of Reality (VOR) announce an \$11,000,000 deal effectively replacing Silicon Graphic's Reality Engine as the image generator used by VOR.

■ Thomas Dolby, Jenny Holzer and Carl Loeffler introduce Intel backed VR artistic and musical exhibits at New York's Guggenheim Museum--SOHO.

■ Bill Gates' Microsoft Corporation buys Montreal based Softimage, a leading 3-D graphics/animation firm and hires Playmation software guru Martin Hash.

■ VR shows up in TV shows: SeaQuest DSV, Murder She Wrote, Conan O'Brien, William Shatner's "Tekwar", Mad About You comedy series and rash of TV commercials.

■ "Moxy" a virtual cartoon host developed by Brad deGraf of Colossal Pictures in San Francisco debuts on the Cartoon Network. "Ratz" another real-time virtual character or "VActor" by SimGraphics Engineering debuts in the UK on the BBC network.

■ Motorola invests in Utah database developer/marketing company Viewpoint Data Labs.

■ StrayLight Corp. ships 2 CyberTron game systems to Walt Disney World in Orlando, FL.

■ 2.5 million dollar VR museum attraction begins 3 year museum tour in U.S. and Canada.

■ Vista Controls, Virtual I/O, CyberSense, and Optics 1 introduce low-cost HMD systems. VictorMaxx shows new HMD with 2 DOF sensors at Winter C.E.S. show in Vegas.

■ Lawnmower Man director, Brett Leonard, begins his next major motion picture "Hideaway" starring

Jeff Goldblum at SONY Pictures filming in Vancouver B.C.

■ "Ghost in the Machine" motion picture horror film using VR techniques debuts in U.S.

■ Former VPL Research employees form "New Leaf" in Palo Alto, Calif. to continue with VR.

■ IAAPA trade show features numerous VR related attractions, ride films and games in L.A.

■ Ono Sendai goes out of business. Steve Tice resigns as President of SimGraphics. Pete Tinker leaves Rockwell and joins Xtensory. Jerry Isdale joins Illusion Engineering.

■ Iwerks Entertainment debuts "Virtual Adventures" using Evans and Sutherland IG system at IAAPA and creates "Cinetropolis" center at Foxwoods Casino in Connecticut.

■ Cybermind opens first VR entertainment center at Embarcadero in San Francisco, Calif.

■ RPI Technology Group announces under \$1,000 stereo graphic board for PC platform, VR furniture, "Cyberchair", and DIVE Dismounted Infantry Virtual Environment project with VR-Trade developers Avatar Partners.

■ VR-1 Television network announced by Colorado based investment partners.

■ Atari announces VR attachments coming for their IBM developed "Jaguar" game system.
